

Friends,





Lesner Bridge Replacement to Start April/May 2014

The start date of the Capital Improvement Project (CIP) 2.168 for the replacement of the Lesner Bridge has been delayed until April/May of 2014. City Project Manager, Chris Wojtowicz gave a presentation to the SDCC on Jan. 24th. Here are a couple of the highlights: Project length about 30 months; No pedestrian crossing while old bridges are being removed and new eastbound span is constructed; Shore Drive improvement project east of Lesner bridge has been postponed until after Bridge replacement; Temporary bulkhead removal is part of contract; Boat traffic will not be restricted during construction; New bridge will have 10+ feet additional height clearance under it for boats. New FEMA Flood Zone Maps May Impact Your Insurance Rates

The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) recently completed a Flood Insurance Study (FIS) report, which will bring about changes to the Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRMs) for Virginia Beach. FIRMs establish Special Flood Hazard Areas (SFHAs), flood risk zones and flood elevations. This data is used to set flood insurance rates, identify where flood insurance is required as a

condition of a federally insured mortgage, and for floodplain management and building regulations.

FEMA has provided an interactive, online tool that enables you to see your current and new preliminary flood hazard zone. Information on the tool and maps can be found at www.sdcc.info. Some of the homes in Cape Story may have been removed from high risk flood zones and others may have been added to them. FEMA has established a 90-day comment/appeal period for Virginia Beach's preliminary flood maps. This 90-day period began Feb. 5 and will run through May 5, 2014.

Virginia Senate Bill SB209 – Riparian Rights for Landowners in Sand Replenishment Projects

Sen. McWaters and Del. Stolle presented bills to restore riparian/littoral rights to beachfront landowners that have had sand deposited for public beach replenishment projects. The results of this bill will not prohibit future beach/sand replenishment projects or change the public right of use currently in existence on the site. For more information visit www.sdcc.info



Parks and Recreation Adopt-A-Program- Successful Clean-up February 15th!

For those new to the area, the CSBTS Civic League participates in the city's Adopt-a-Program for trash pick-up along local highways, parks and trails. 


