PARADE THEME - "Fabulous 50"

The amazing Cape Story parade, like the City of Virginia Beach, is celebrating its 50th anniversary with a "Fabulous 50" theme. Bring your old photos to share, dress up in a past parade costume, create a generational float of all the family members that have participated over the years. Let's make this a grand celebration.

This year's parade and brunch will take place from 10:00 am to 12:00 pm (noon) on Thursday July 4th. The parade route will start on Beech at the bike path, proceed down Beech to Poinciana, follow Poinciana to Bayberry, turn left on Bayberry and end in the neighborhood park. All bike riders, floats and marchers need to line up for the parade between 9:30am - 9:45am. Please be careful spilling out onto Shore Drive. If you have to, line your float up in Food Lion's parking lot and we will work you into the parade as it starts moving.

As in past years, trophies will be given for Most Original, Most Patriotic and Best Theme. The parade will be followed by a brunch in the park. There will also be biscuits, doughnuts, fruit and patriotic tunes.

As she has done in years past, an ice cream truck will also be provided courtesy of LYNN HUME, RE/MAX Allegiance.

This year's fireworks show will be presented by the local Virginia Beach company, VA Pyro. The display will consist of 625 shells and will be launched around 9:20 pm on Thursday July 4th from the beach at First Landing State park. The rain date will be Friday July 5th at the same time. If it looks like rain, please check your emails and www.capestory.org for updates. Please remember - Storage, handling and use of fireworks without a permit from the Fire Marshal's Office is a violation of City ordinance 12-43.2 and is a Class 1 Misdemeanor. Class 1 Misdemeanors are punishable by up to a \$2500 fine and/or 12 months in jail.

Storm Water Improvements – Large Scale Shore Drive & Neighborhood Project Being Planned

In June, the City's Public Works Department will be presenting the study for a massive \$80+ million project between the Lesner Bridge and First Landing State Park. This project will include several large pump stations that will discharge water through pipes into the Chesapeake Bay. Some property may be identified for condemnation or acquisition. Check out www.sdcc.info for scheduled presentation dates.



2016 looks to be a difficult year on Shore Drive (Lesner Bridge Replacement and Safety Improvements between State Park and Bridge)

Capital Improvement Project (CIP) 2.168 for the replacement of the Lesner Bridge is set to begin construction January 2014. The project will take an estimated 3 years to complete December 2016. A new 4 lane wide span will be built north of the existing bridges. Then the four travel lanes of traffic will be routed to this new span while the old bridges are removed. The new eastbound bridge will then be built.

Lynnhaven River Now and City of Virginia Beach team up to build Oyster Aquaculture Site

Lynnhaven River Now and the City will be building an oyster aquaculture facility on Broad Bay Island. The facility will be located on City property between the North Great Neck bridge spans. The facility will create spat on shell that will be used by LRNOW and sold to oyster farmers for use in the Lynnhaven River. All monies made from this operation will go back into maintaining the facility. The area will contain several grow tanks, a small office, a boat ramp and dock and will be nicely landscaped with a fence surrounding the site.

Gather Important Documents (waterproof container)

- Insurance documents
- Medical records
- Bank account numbers
- Social security card/I.D.
- Proper identification/immunization records for pet

Pack Personal Essentials

- Cash, credit cards
- Spare keys/local road map
- Cell phone/autocharger
- Clothing/rain gear/sturdy shoes/utility gloves
- Blankets/pillows
- Toiletries/medications
- Eyeglasses
- Valuables (jewelry, family pictures)
- Pet essentials (muzzle, leash, carrier)
- Toys/games/books

Prepare Your Home/Property

- Secure/store items from yard
- Trim loose/dead branches from trees
- Secure windows with storm shutters/plywood (pre-drill holes)
- Remove satellite dishes/antennae/roof turbines
- Clean out gutters
- Stack sandbags around exterior doorframes
- Securely moor or move your watercraft to a safe location
- Tools (hammer, screwdriver, chainsaw, etc.)
- Plastic tarp (roof/window repair)
- Clean up supplies (for yard and home)
- Camera to document before/after

- Know how to turn off your home's gas, electricity and water

Neighborhood Watch

Neighborhood Watch is a program that has been implemented in Cape Story by the Sea to prevent crime. The program is simple - it involves neighborhood concern and awareness, along with police cooperation. The concept is for residents to be alert to suspicious activity and report anything unusual to the police.

We work closely with the Crime Prevention Unit of the Virginia Beach Police Department. They provide guidelines for the Program to be successful. Some of these include home inspections for suggestions such as improved lighting and landscaping improvements to eliminate hiding places for wouldbe criminals. Anyone can request a home inspection by calling 385-1757.

Another feature of Neighborhood Watch is our email communication system. There are currently over 600 residents in our neighborhood who receive important messages regarding crime that has occurred and alerts of suspicious activities. This email list needs constant updating due to residents relocating.

In the coming months, there will be an effort to complete an update. This involves "Block Captains" visiting their neighbors to invite them to be a Neighborhood Watch member and be added to the email list.

Volunteers are needed to become Block Captains for approximately 10-15 residences each. If you are willing to help with this important update, please call the Neighborhood Watch Coordinator, Regina Wallace, at 496-6458 or email neighborhoodwatch1@cox.net.

Please remember to call 911 if you see a crime in action and call 385-5000, option 1, to report crimes after they have occurred or to report any suspicious activity. Also, please call or email the NW Coordinator so crime reports and suspicious activities can be shared with our community.
