

Shore Drive Neighborhood Parking Study and Parking Regulations

City Traffic Engineer, Mike Shahsiah, spoke to the Cape Story by the Sea Civic Association at their April general meeting. Mr. Shahsiah explained that the study was being conducted at the request of the Bayfront Advisory Committee. They study's purpose is to find more parking spots north of Shore Drive between the Lesner Bridge and the State Park. Illegal "No Parking" signs will be identified and removed. Existing areas designated as no parking by the City will be reevaluated for possible removal. It was also noted that parking is NOT allowed anywhere along Shore Drive. Call the police non-emergency number 385-5000 to report illegal parking. It was also mentioned that off-street parking is allowed along all streets in Cape Story by the Sea and Lynnhaven Colony. All four tires must be off the roadway to be considered off-street.

Cape Henry Beach Sand Replenishment

Sand from the Lynnhaven Inlet Boat Ramp spoils area will be placed on the Cape Henry beach starting at Kendall Street and west toward the Lynnhaven Fishing Pier. The project should be completed by the end of June and will not be worked on the weekends. The trucks will access the beach at Oak Street. Any problems or complaints should be directed to the project manager, Mr. Phill Roehrs at 385-8985.


Chesapeake Bay Foundation Brock Environmental Center

The Center is scheduled to open late Fall 2014. The Chesapeake Bay Foundation is building the Brock Environmental Center to engage, inform, and inspire generations about the environment and how we can all help Save the Bay[™]. The Center, located at Pleasure House Point in Virginia Beach, Virginia, will be an innovative example of environmentally sensitive and sustainable building—the first in Virginia to embrace a net-zero energy and net-zero water approach—and advance CBF's efforts to defend one of the nation's most valuable and threatened natural resources, the Chesapeake Bay. The Brock Environmental Center will meet the strictest environmental standards in accordance with the Living Building Challenge™. The building's footprint will use less than an acre of CBF's 10-acre parcel, a very small percentage of the total area of Pleasure House Point.

The Brock Environmental Center will be CBF's regional home for its award-winning environmental education programs, which provide experiences for 2,500 students and teachers across Hampton Roads each year. The Center will also provide space for other local conservation partners, including Lynnhaven River NOW, and for community meetings and conservation trainings.




As she has done in years past, an ice cream truck will also be provided courtesy of LYNN HUME, RE/MAX Allegiance.


