President's Report

New Co-Chair of Clean Up and Beautification Committee is Diana Albis who will join Shirley Drye. Nor' Sandy-- Same bike trail, same flooding areas on short streets, damage not as extensive and water not as high BUT no changes in any flood drain or pump station to prevent flooding into 8 (or more) homes.

Cape Story has requested the Public Works Dept to install a "plug" that was tested at Ocean Park and prevented their usual extensive flooding during Nor' Sandy high tides.

Mike Mundy, Water Resources Program Manager, Dept of Public Works, discussed city wide storm water plans (3 to 4 month project) at the CSBTS September meeting and agreed on a return presentation for more details at a later date after the studies completed. MEANTIME we had Nor' Sandy and NO plug in place and no changes in flood water management since 2009 Nor' Ida or replacement of collapsed pipe (Nov 2011) at the end of Maple Street.



Todd Solomon, Shore Drive Community Coalition (SDCC)

Storm Water Improvements Long Term Plans

The City's Public Works Department has informed us that they are planning a massive \$80+ million project for the area between the Lesner Bridge and First Landing State Park. This project will include several large pump stations that will discharge water through pipes into the Chesapeake Bay. The project could take 10-15 years and possibly require condemnation of homes. Cape Story and the Shore Drive Community Coalition will have City speakers at future meetings, so keep an eye out for notices.

Chesapeake Beach Fire Station Construction

This project replaces the existing 9.760 square foot facility supporting 4 Fire and 2-to-5 Emergency Medical Services (EMS) personnel, 1 fire engine and 1 ambulance on a daily basis, and various other pieces of equipment that are infrequently used (ranging from fire trucks to zodiac boats). The existing facility has 2 drive through bays (2 vehicle capacity each) and 3 front load only bays (1 vehicle capacity each). The replacement will be a more efficient 3-bay facility ranging from 13.800 to 14.200 square feet based on the General Booth and Sandbridge stations. Cost estimates were based on 14,000 square feet. The replacement facility will house both Fire and EMS personnel and equipment. The new site will be at the intersection of Shore Drive and Northampton Boulevard. This facility is priority 10 on the City's Top 13 Facility Replacement Priority list. The project is scheduled to be completed Summer 2013 http://cipstatus.vbgov.com/cipstatus/ ProjectDetail.aspx?id=488

Shore Drive Improvements (Lesner Bridge to Great Neck Rd.)

The City of Virginia Beach conducted a Citizen Information Meeting on Wednesday, November 30, 2011, at John B. Dey Elementary School. A 60% plan submittal was received at the end of February and has been reviewed. A 90% plan submittal is expected at

the beginning of April 2013. Construction is expected to begin in the early spring of 2014. http://cipstatus.vbgov.com/cipstatus/ ProjectDetail.aspx?id=1833

Great Neck Road and Lynnhaven Road

The City is finishing a safety improvement project at this intersection that moved the turning lanes on Great Neck in toward the medians. This should allow cars turning onto Lynnhaven Road to have better visibility. A traffic light is not being installed as part of this project, but City Traffic Engineers have been asked to create a design/plans for one in case the City decides to place one there in the future.

Pleasure House Point Park Update

The Park was officially opened to the public on October 12, 2012. The Chesapeake Bay Foundation received approval on Nov. 14th from the Planning Commission for a Conditional Use Permit for their 10 acres to allow the construction of a 10,000 square foot environmental learning facility and Hampton Roads headquarter office space.

Help Save Long Creek, the Fight is Not Over!

Our tranquil little corner of Virginia Beach was recently threatened by the possible construction of a dredge material transfer site on Long Creek, right next to Marina Shores Marina (The Maple Street site).

We won a significant battle at the Board of Zoning Appeals (BZA) hearing last September, 2011. The BZA's opinion: Maple Street is not a permissible site for a permanent dredge spoils facility for a variety of reasons. The City appealed the BZA's ruling to the Virginia Beach Circuit Court, requesting that the court overrule the BZA determination. That case is pending and has yet to be heard.

On the heels of the BZA ruling, the Beaches and Waterways Commission reported to the City that the Maple Street site was not a good fit for the dredge spoils facility location. Another win for our community.

The City passed a resolution stating that they would remove Maple Street from the City's Neighborhood Dredge Program. However, the City refused to withdraw their appeal of the BZA determination AND refused to withdraw their request for a permit to

dredge Long Creek by both mechanical and hydraulic methods.

The Marine Resource Commission (VMRC) granted an extended permit that would allow the City to dredge and transfer a large amount of material at the same Maple Street site. It seems the City is determined to make this a dredge transfer station, even if the citizens who live next door are strongly opposed to it.

We need your help to preserve the Maple Street site!

Ask the Virginia Beach Circuit Court to uphold the BZA determination in our favor. The "Maple Street Legal Fund" has been established to help with legal fees involved in moving ahead with the Circuit Court appeal. We greatly appreciate any financial donation you can make to help save Long Creek.

Write, call, and email the Mayor and City Council members. Tell them you DO NOT want a dredge material transfer station at the Maple Street site.


