

President's Report

Dear Cape Story by the Sea Residents,



CSBTS will again be required by the city of Virginia Beach to pay a 10% (TEN PERCENT) event tax on ticket sales, in addition to the required event permit (\$50). The event Tax has been over \$1000 for the last several years. These funds would have been added to funding for CSBTS sponsored events for our community (including Spring Fling, July 4th brunch & parade, Oyster Roast, Santa in the Park, support of the 5 to 6 Holiday Families, and Skipjack Newsletter).

CSBTS officers have discussed with the Virginia Beach Commissioner of Revenue as well as City Council members the possibly of exemption for CSBTS for this event tax and currently CSBTS is in the process of seeking 501(c) (4) tax status which would allow CSBTS to:

- 1. Receive contributions or fees deductible as a business expense
- 2. Make related income exempt from federal income tax
- 3. Make investment income exempt from federal income tax
- 4. Engage in legislative advocacy
- 5. Engage in public advocacy not related to legislation or election of candidates.

501(4)(c) DOES NOT allow the organization to receive tax-deductible charitable contributions. The proposal to the City is that a 501(4)(c) status would allow exemption from the 10% event tax on ticket sales. This would require an amendment to Virginia Beach, Virginia Code of Ordinances – CODE- Chapter 35 – TAXATION – ARTICLE VIII.ADMISSIONS TAX- Sec. 35-182 Levy of taxes; classifications; amount; administration (d): (2)(3)(4)--- this code allows the commissioner of revenue to determine if an allowance of event tax exemption is acceptable and shall provide the city manager a list of all events benefiting charity for which no admissions tax was paid, and an estimate of the tax that would have otherwise been paid.

SO, CSBTS is pursuing a 501 (c) (4) status to plead our cause with one more piece of documentation that as a social organization CSBTS is providing a necessary public or member service at reasonable cost and should be exempt from event tax on ticket sales.

Non-profit organizations (CSBTS): the Board must measure the activities of the organization a necessary public or member service at a reasonable cost, the programs are in line with the organization's tax-exempt purpose and goals, the programs are worth the time and money the organizations spends on them.

The NOVEMBER CSBTS meeting was attended by NINE members at the Virginia Beach Resort Hotel on Monday, Nov 9, 2015. The Hotel provides CSBTS a meeting room that is easily accessible to the 650 plus residents in Cape Story by the Sea. The guest presentation by RESCUETOUCH was very timely to residents aging in place in Cape Story as well as residents recovering from medical conditions that require extra assistance. Hampton Roads Transit and the City of Virginia Beach, at the request of the Bayfront Advisory Committee, have studied the possibility of a limited loop bus service between Shore Drive and the Oceanfront. The service will operate on a trial basis next year and run from May to September 2016. Check out www.sdcc.info for updates.

Shore Drive Improvement Presentation – Monday January 25, 2016

Monday January 25, 2016 at 7:30pm Ocean Park Rescue Squad, the SDCC will host a presentation on the planned Shore Drive Improvement Project between Great Neck Rd and Lesner Bridge. Mr. Wilson, Public Works, will update us on the project details including safety, roadway and aesthetics improvement and project scheduling.

Lynnhaven Colony/Cape Story Tidal Gate Project Update

Capital Improvement Project (CIP-7.409) is scheduled to begin January 2016 and be completed by December 2016. The project calls for three automated sluice gates to be installed that will open and close depending on the tide and rainfall amounts. Two will be located in Lynnhaven Colony and one in Cape Story at the First Landing pump station. Work will be done in parallel by the same contractor with an estimated 12 month duration.



Neighborhood Watch

VBCCO Members FBI Presentation

Regional FBI office representatives Vanessa Torres, Community Outreach Specialist, and Agent John Adams were guest speakers at the September VBCCO Meeting. Their presentation explained the FBI's services and provided helpful hints for residents. The following bullet points provide a brief recap of their material.

FBI's Priorities-

Counter-terrorism

- Evolved a lot in the 14 years since 9/11; they are now well-integrated with military overseas
- Only issue- pulling out overseas leaves them with less information
- Big threat today- the loners. Harder to identify them. Homegrown, violent extremists can find out detailed information via the Internet, target specific individuals if desired.

Cyber-threats

- International hacking into major computer systems- China, Russia. Pressure on the White House to make official comments about this.
- Internet scams- if it sounds too good to be true, it probably is.
 - Don't give out personal information to callers.
 - Verify is charitable organizations are legitimate first.
 - Scammers more sophisticated- can get info about family right from the Internet- e.g. Craig's List.

o Economic Espionage

- Foreign governments attempting to acquire trade secrets
- Insider threats to trade secrets/intellectual property using the supply chain. E.g. access to R&D or academic institution, copy from thumb-drive.
