



Virginia Senate Bill SB926 – Change to City's Wetlands Board Review

Councilmen Wood and Jones sponsored a City request to State Legislators to eliminate local VB wetland board review of areas being served by the City's new Neighborhood Dredging Program. SDCC, the Chesapeake Bay Foundation and Lynnhaven River Now and thousands of Shore Drive residents banded together to voice their opposition to this request. State Senator Jeff McWaters heard the citizens and dismissed his bill from committee. Read more about this issue at www.sdcc.info

Storm Water Improvements – Large Scale Shore Drive & Neighborhood Project Being Planned

On January 17, 2013, the City's Public Works Department briefed the public on the planning for a massive \$80+ million project for the area between the Lesner Bridge and First Landing State Park. This project will include several large pump stations that will discharge water through pipes into the Chesapeake Bay. Site surveying is being conducted and a final report will be presented to the public in May/June 2013.



Shore Drive Improvements (Lesner Bridge to Great Neck Rd.)

SDCC and the Bayfront Advisory Committee are asking City Engineers to hold a 60% design review meeting so the citizens can review all the changes over the past 15 months. The plans are being updated as a result of the new storm water improvement plans. No date for the public meeting has been schedule, but it will most likely be the late Spring or early Summer 2013. Notices will be posted on www.sdcc.info and emailed to SDCC newsletter members.

Chesapeake Bay Foundation Relocates Trees and Shrubs to Support Center Construction

Volunteers and Chesapeake Bay Foundation Staff are beginning to make some changes to the property at Pleasure House Point. In order to begin preparations for CBF's Brock Environmental Center construction, trees and shrubs are being moved from within the construction area to habitat restoration areas around the site.

The site has a few small live oaks, pines and shrubs that are good candidates for moving by hand. The trees are small and in most cases not located in areas well suited for long-term growth. In most cases the shrubs, commonly referred to as high tide bush, can be trimmed and transplanted with minimal care.

In order to give the larger live oaks the best chance of survival after their move, they were moved using equipment commonly referred to as a tree spade. The piece of equipment allows for preserving as much of the root system of the tree as possible. This is especially important given the


