- <u>Storm Water Problems Empsy</u> to send out City's draft report so the neighborhood can provide comments. Draft recommends a \$15million central pump station similar to the north end improvement. No simple fixes were recommended by the City's study.
- Shore Drive Safety Shore Drive speed limit will be reduced from 45mph to 35mph starting June 15<sup>th</sup>. The speed limit reduction will start at Pleasure House Rd and run to North Great Neck Rd.
