Virginia Beach has held several public meetings for citizens' (that would be YOU if you live in Virginia Beach) input on the legislatively mandated Five Year Comprehensive Plan for our City. This is required by law to plan where we see the city heading - think City Center, Lesner Bridge replacement, rural land use, healthcare and education centers---all have been reviewed/discussed in previous 5 year plans. I attended the meeting at the Convention Center on October 30, 2014 and was concerned at the lack of citizen attendance at this public meeting. Employees from most of the City departments were there to share information and to seek our comments and suggestions as residents of Virginia Beach (VB), and we thirty or so attendee citizens did the best we could. Based on the limited attendance, it would appear that VB must be doing OUTSTANDING work for all citizens and everyone is pleased with VB policy and plans.... PLEASE CONSIDER BECOMING MORE ENGAGED IN YOUR CIVIC ASSOCIATION, CITY, STATE and COUNTRY.

# Beach Comprehensive Plan

## City of Virginia Beach Comprehensive Plan Review for 2015

On November 13<sup>th</sup>, the city held the last of five open-house presentations for citizen input regarding the current Comprehensive Plan. The Comprehensive Plan details the city's plans for long-term growth and development. Representatives from numerous city departments were on-hand to review existing plans and gather feedback from attendees.

The Comprehensive Plan is reviewed every five years for suggested updates and amendments. The 2015 review begins now, and the city is looking for citizen feedback as the process continues.


The plan addresses topics such as land use, transportation, preserving/improving neighborhoods, the environment, economic development and parks/open spaces. It targets specific focus- areas, such as Shore Drive corridor plans, environmental framework (e.g. flooding concerns), urban and strategic growth areas such as Hilltop and the Oceanfront, transitional area land-use and a master transportation plan.

In the next few months, the city will identify focus groups and provide workshops to review ideas and provide suggestions prior to the creation of a draft plan. This will be followed by a final draft and public hearings, with the amended plan approved and implemented by City Council by year-end.




