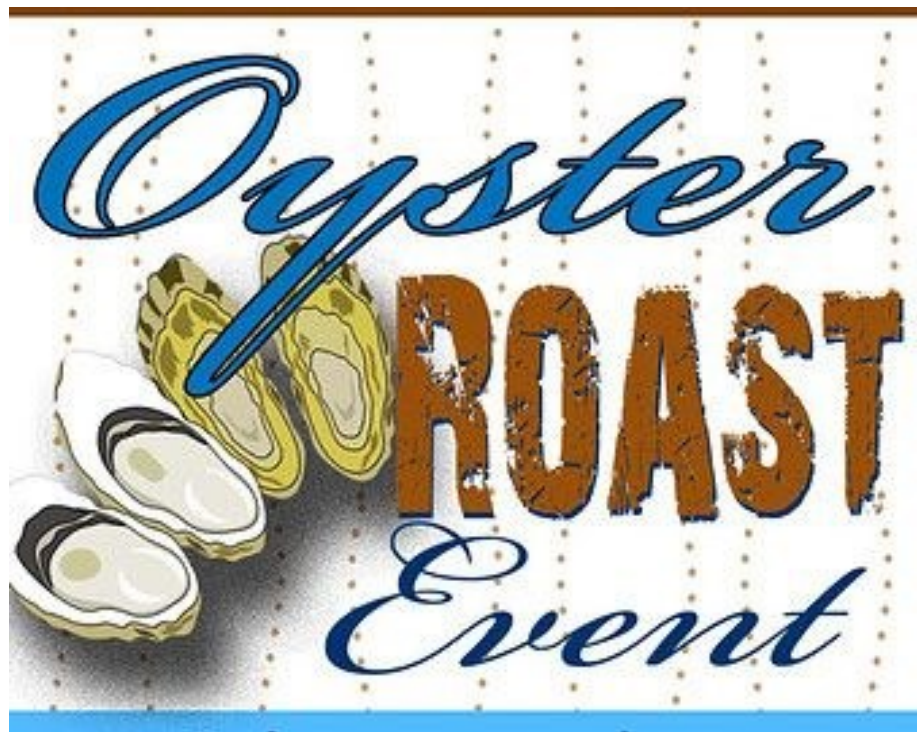
**THE LINEUP**- **FRONT**-KIDS/BIKES/RIDING TOYS

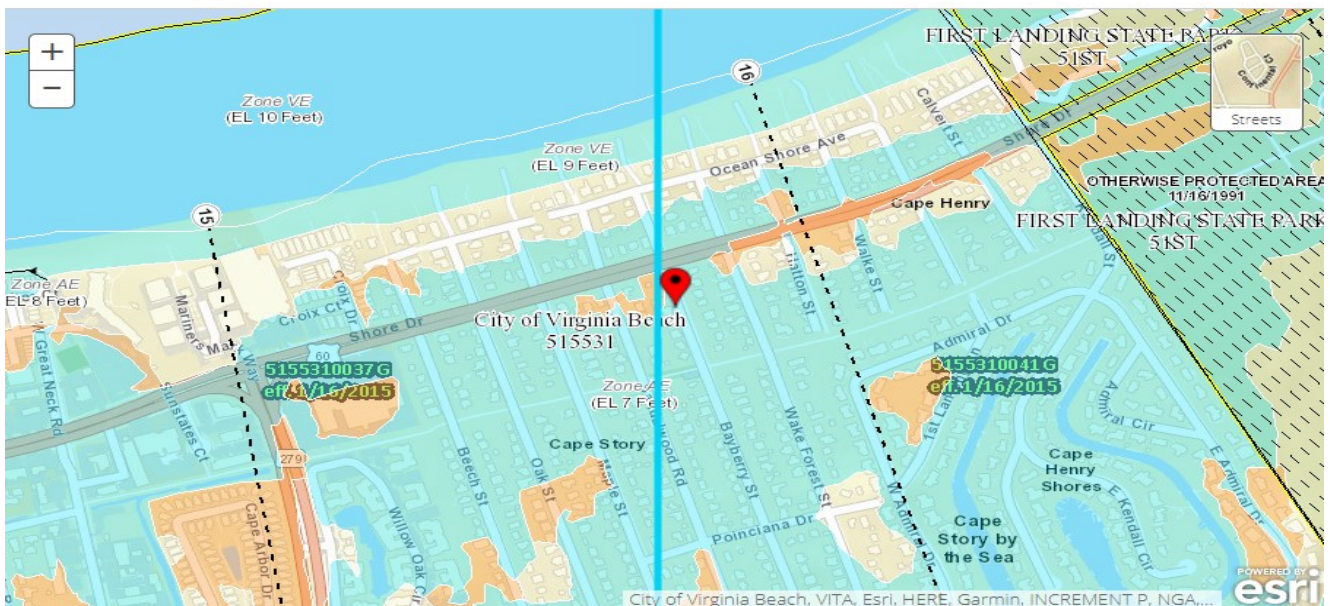
A recent article in the *Virginian Pilot* announced “Virginia Beach accepted into flood insurance program that will reduce premiums.” What does this mean for Cape Story residents?

## VIRGINIA BEACH

According to staff writer Alissa Skelton, “Nearly half of the residents and businesses with flood insurance policies will receive reduced premiums starting May 1. City Manager Dave Hansen announced on Tuesday that Virginia Beach was accepted into FEMA’s Community Rating System, a program that discounts flood-insurance policies. About 12,000 residents and businesses will collectively save \$1 million annually, said Whitney McNamara, an environmental planner for the city.” The article, which ran on April 2, stated that, “About 8,400 homes or businesses in high-risk flood zones, which have an average premium of \$830 per year, will see a 15 percent drop, McNamara said. That would decrease their payments to an average of \$706 annually. Another 3,300 that have sustained flooding losses in the past will receive a 5 percent discount. On average, they pay \$532 yearly, McNamara said, and that would reduce their insurance to about \$505 a year. By May 1, the reduced rates should be applied automatically, McNamara said. Residents should check with insurance companies if the discount doesn’t show up.”

# CELEBRATING CAPE STORY HISTORY

## Historic Marker Dedication

The Virginia Beach Historic Preservation Commission dedicated a state highway marker commemorating the Meeting of Three Commanders at Lynnhaven Colony Park's shelter.

The meeting occurred Sept. 18, 1781, among Gen. George Washington, commander-in-chief of the combined American and French armies; the Comte de Rochambeau, commander of the French expeditionary army, and Admiral François Joseph Paul de Grasse, commander of a large French fleet of warships. These commanders met aboard de Grasse's flagship on Lynnhaven Bay. It was here that final strategies were devised that led to the Franco-American victory at Yorktown.



The marker dedication ceremony was held at the park shelter and attended by Gen. André Lanata, Supreme Allied Commander Transformation of NATO Allied Command Transformation. He is a French Air Force officer. Gen. Lanata was joined by Virginia Beach Mayor Robert M. "Bobby" Dyer along with members of the Virginia Beach Historic Preservation Commission.

**Civilian Conservation Corps Company 1371** (approx. 0.6 miles away) Marker can be reached from the intersection of Shore Drive (U.S. 60) and Virginia Route 347.

**First Landing State Park** (approx. 0.6 miles away)

**Land Ho!** (approx. 0.6 miles away) Marker can be reached from Shore Drive (U.S. 60) near Cypress Swamp (Virginia Route 343), on the left when traveling east.

**Seashore State Park** (approx. 0.6 miles away) Marker is on Shore Drive (U.S. 60) near Great Neck Road, on the right when traveling west.

**Chesapeake Indians** (approx. 1 mile away) Marker is on Thomas Bishop Lane near North Great Neck Road, on the right when traveling north.

**First Landing** (approx. 2.8 miles away) Marker is on Shore Dr (Route 60) north of Atlantic Ave, on the right when traveling north.

**François Joseph Paul de Grasse** (approx. 3.1 miles away in Fort Story)

**History of Cape Henry Lighthouse** (approx. 3.1 miles away in Fort Story) Marker can be reached from the intersection of Atlantic Avenue and Cebu Road.

**First Landing** (approx. 3.1 miles away) Marker can be reached from Atlantic Avenue near Cape Henry Road.

**First Public Works Project of the United States Government** (approx. 3.1 miles away in Fort Story) Marker is on Atlantic Avenue near Cape Henry Road.

**Cape Henry Memorial** (approx. 3.1 miles away in Fort Story)

**Battle of the Capes** (approx. 3.1 miles away in Fort Story)

**Old Cape Henry Lighthouse** (approx. 3.1 miles away in Fort Story) Marker is on Atlantic Avenue just east of Cape Henry Road, on the right when traveling east.

# SHORE DRIVE COMMUNITY COALITION NEWS

**4th of July Fireworks for Cape Henry Beach** – City Council and Staff are evaluating the request to take over the planning and execution of the show. A decision should be forthcoming after the “Something in the Water” event is over which will allow Staff to focus on the request.

**Parking Meters at Lynnhaven Boat Ramp** – The City has installed a metered parking kiosk for public parking at the Lynnhaven Boat Ramp. If you plan on using this lot, please be aware of the update to avoid tickets.

**Shore Drive Improvements in Ocean Park to Start Soon** – \$600,000 of improvement to the Shore Drive/Stratford Road intersection, is fully funded and expected to begin later this spring. This would involve a “fully functional” traffic light with pedestrian crossing signals, an emergency signal to accommodate Ocean Park Fire and Rescue.

**Cape Henry Ditch Volunteer Clean Out Corps Proposal** – Representatives of the Chesapeake Bay Foundation will be discussing a plan to have volunteers clean out and maintain a section of the ditch behind Food Lion. The Cape Story meeting will take place on Monday May 13th at 7:30pm at Lynnhaven Colony Congregational Church.

## Leash Law Changes Put on Hold

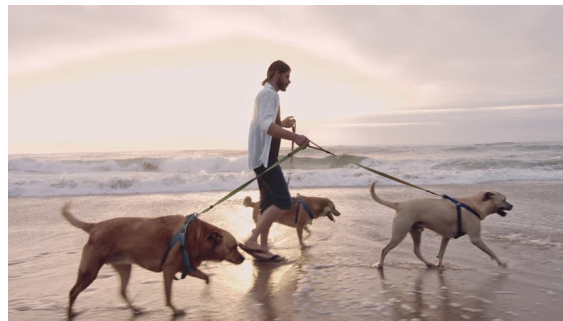
The Virginia Beach City Council decided to not move more forward with a proposed dog leashed law change, for now.

On Thursday, the city council decided to allow Animal Control to monitor and evaluate situations involving dogs on local beaches over the next 12 months.

Animal Control will also continue to enforce the existing law and educate dog owners in regards to proper control of their dogs on city beaches.

**Current law** says dogs on any city beach may be off their leash under control by the owner. The only exceptions are from Memorial Day to Labor Day. During that time, dogs are not allowed on the beach from Rudee Inlet to 42nd Street, and dogs are not allowed on all other beaches from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.

The proposed law change would have required dogs to be leashed at all times on all city beaches.

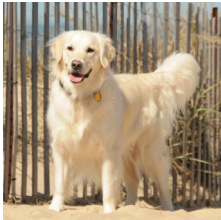
